RE: Invasive Species Management Plan in Ohio

I called the Ohio Department of Agriculture, Plant Health Division, Plan Pest Control Department and asked to speak to someone about noxious weeds. I was transferred to Mr. Dan Kenny. I told him that I was working on a proposed pipeline project that spanned Ohio, and asked if Ohio had a requirement for an Invasive Species Management Plan.

Mr. Kenny said that the Ohio Department of Agriculture did not require such a plan, but they did maintain the list of noxious species for the state. He suggested that I contact the Department of Natural Resources to make sure they did not require a plan. He also offered the number to the Ohio Seed Improvement Department for a list of certified suppliers of 'weedfree' straw, assuming we would need it in restoration. The number is 614-889-1136. I told him we would most likely need to contact them and thanked him for the number and his time.

I am sorry, I have been (and am still) on vacation (guess I forgot to set up my auto-reply, oops) so I can't entirely be sure that I understand what you're asking to be able to answer appropriately (normally I would call). That being said, I assume you mean that when there is a project affecting wetlands, lakes, and streams in Michigan (which is my area of expertise) is a specific Invasive Species Management Plan required? The answer to that question is not really a yes or no since invasive species management does need to be addressed as part of any utility project, but a specific plan is not generally required for submission, unless there is some special issue relating to that project. That being said, that does not mean that a plan is not required at all for most projects. Several conditions that address invasive species are often written into the issued permit. Some BMPs are written into the utilities projects General Permit and Minor Project categories themselves. It is also written in the statute (Part 303) that if you are utilizing the utilities exemptions (i.e.; projects that are exempt from needing a wetland permit), the BMPs are to be followed that include invasive species control and avoidance/minimization measures. I believe the FERC guide is referred to in the permit categories for utilities, but there is not yet a specific BMP guide for utilities in Michigan. That is actually something we are working on right now.

I hope this is what you were looking for...in short, the answer is no formal submission is typically required as part of a wetlands, lakes, or streams project, but BMPs relating to invasive species are required to be followed as part of any project affecting wetlands, lakes, and streams to ensure that the spread is avoided and minimized. It is up to the company to ensure that these BMPs are in place and carried out, and if they are not, then the exemption would not have applied.
