ROVER PIPELINE DONATES \$10,000 TO ANN ARBOR YMCA FOR SCHOLARSHIPS TO SUMMER CAMP

Donation brings Rover Pipeline's Total Community Donations to more than \$4 million

Ann Arbor, MI, September 24, 2018 – Rover Pipeline executives were on hand yesterday to present a \$10,000 check to the Ann Arbor YMCA yesterday as part of Rover Pipeline's commitment to support local organizations in the communities through which the pipeline passes. The donation will be used towards scholarships to summer day camp sessions at Camp Birkett during the summer 2019 season.

Rover Pipeline has long stated it is committed to being a good neighbor, a good business partner and a valued member of the communities through which the project traverses. To date, Rover Pipeline has donated more than \$4 million to various charitable organizations, youth programs, emergency responder associations and community groups across the four-state route.

"We are excited to be able to provide funding for approximately 62 scholarships for children who would otherwise not be able to participate. As of August 23rd of this year, the pipeline received FERC approval for 100 percent of the long-haul contractual commitments on the project. Rover began service on the project on August 31, 2017. Restoration activities along the full line are expected to be complete by the end of the year.
